



International Study Excursion of the European and International Affairs Master's Program at the Turkish-German University

Turkish-German University (TGU/TDU)

University of Cologne (UoC)

Brussels and Berlin

May 30, 2022 – June 12, 2022









Report	

After two consecutive years of online lectures and meetings only, the joint summer excursion of the Turkish-German University and the University of Cologne 2022 could finally be held present again. 12 students of the European and International Affairs Master's Program of TDU had the opportunity to visit Brussels and Berlin to deepen their knowledge and to get first-hand insights of practitioners from political institutions.

During their stay in Brussels, 12 students of TDU together with 16 students of the law and political department of the UoC participated in a simulation game in the framework of the interdisciplinary and international seminar PROTEUS (for further information see the report on the PROEUS-Seminar 2022).

The interdisciplinary and international seminar PROTEUS, funded by the *Kölner Gymnasial-und Stiftungsfond*, was held in the summer semester of 2022. The seminar, which concerns the law and politics of the European Union, introduced the students to current European Affairs and was finalized with an excursion to Brussels, where students not only experienced the key institutions of the European Union (EU) but also simulated a summit of the European Council (EUCO). Throughout the program, all students showed high interest in the wide working field of political experts and were fascinated by the broad variety of possible job opportunities. The excursion's first week took place in Brussels where students focused on seeing how the European institutions work. In order to have a better understanding, the visits to European External Action Service, European Parliament, and European Council were helpful. Also, the Permanent Delegation of Turkey to the EU was visited which allowed the students to ask questions about Turkey's EU perspective and its relations with the EU to the ambassador.

One of the students at TDU, H. Şüheda Solmaz describes her experience as unique and productive:

'Four years of grad education combining law and IR in one of the best universities in Turkey with full scholarship, just to see that two weeks of excursion would have taught









me better. I have just understood that they have been teaching me and a better understanding of theory. It really helped to see the work in action both to detect pros and cons. I now have a better vision of what to expect from my career and how to develop it accordingly.'

One of the other participants of the excursion, İ. Maya Saygın emphasizes how rich the excursion schedule was. According to her, it was important to meet experts, and civil servants and try to understand how international and bilateral relations are shaping especially now, at a time when the European Union and Turkey do not spend their honeymoon in their relations.

The second part of our excursion took place in Berlin where our students met with German and Turkish civil servants working in the federal ministries and embassy of the Turkish Republic in Germany. Also, they visited the German Bundestag and Deutscher Dom at Gendarmenmarkt where the students visited an exhibition on Germany's parliamentary history.

The visits in Berlin allowed the students to think about current challenges in bilateral relations between Turkey and Germany. The excursion program's focus was not only to have a better understanding of the institutions of the European Union but also to observe the assessments of the German side in terms of relations with Turkey. Especially, it was important to see how the Federal Government distributes administerial tasks to the ministers in the framework of bilateral relations.

The excursion had been organized by the Centre of Turkey and European Union Studies ('CETEUS') at the UoC and was accompanied by the Head of European and International Relations Master's Program Dr. Phillip Decker and Research Assistant Emre Midilli of the TDU.
